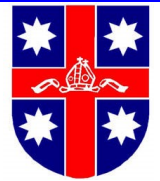

Dear People,

The wealthy man in today's Gospel reading is sometimes called 'the rich young ruler'. He is devout, observant of the Jewish Law and attractive. He is the sort of person that many would like to welcome to their faith community. But when asked if he would sell his possessions, give the money to the poor and follow Jesus, 'his countenance fell', and he went away sorrowful. The episode leads to Jesus teaching that it will be difficult for the rich to enter the kingdom of God. "It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God" (Mark 9.24).

In New Testament times, many believed that wealth was a sign of God's blessing. Conversely, illness and poverty were regarded as a punishment. When Jesus and the disciples passed a man blind from birth, they asked him: "Who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind" (John 9.1)? Jesus refuted this popular perception and he indicated that God's healing of the sick reveals his love for all people.

What is the problem with wealth? The Old Testament reminds us that the chief sin is idolatry. The Swiss theologian Paul Tillich defines idolatry as being 'ultimately concerned with that which is not of ultimate concern'. In modern Australia many people 'worship' money, power, status and material possessions. The trouble with idolatry is twofold: it diverts us from caring for others and it robs us of the freedom to be ourselves. Of course, there is nothing wrong with people being wealthy, but the 'problem' stems from an obsession with one's possessions. Writing to the Christians of Corinth, St Paul refers to idols. He then changes his terminology and refers to demons (I Corinthians 10.20). I think that he recognised that God wants us to be happy, to be free, to be fully alive to our humanity and that the worship of other 'gods' creates a stumbling block to our liberation.

Two 'ex-rich young rulers' have greatly influenced Anglicans, St Gregory the Great and St Francis of Assisi. Gregory was the son of a Roman Senator and, as a young man, he was appointed as Prefect of the City of Rome. He was very wealthy. But he gave away all his property and became a monk. Eventually, he was elected as the Bishop of Rome and, as 'the Apostle to the English' he was responsible for sending St Augustine as the first Archbishop of Canterbury. St Francis was the son of a wealthy cloth merchant. At a time when the Church in Italy had become caught up with issues of power and wealth, St Francis recognised a responsibility to forsake material possessions in order to wed 'lady poverty'.
