

Dear People,

The First Sunday After Pentecost is observed as Trinity Sunday. This is a relatively recent feast, universal in the Western Church since 1334, and affirmed by the Book of Common Prayer of 1662. Until the late 1970s we kept the Sundays of ordinary time as 'Sundays After Trinity', and many Anglican churches and theological institutions are named 'the Holy Trinity'. The doctrine of the Holy Trinity is not an attempt to define God. Rather, it is a recognition that the one God revealed in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus is revealed as three persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Jesus is both fully human and fully divine, and the Holy Spirit is God breathing his life and love into all of creation. The doctrine does not exhaust our understanding of God and we recognise that 'we see in a mirror dimly' (I Corinthians 13.12). But it enables us to celebrate the one God who is above all things (the Father), beside all things (the Son) and within all things (the Spirit).

When we first meet strangers we tend to make judgements. We call this 'making first impressions', and I confess that I do it all the time. Sometimes my judgements are wildly inaccurate, and there are many occasions when I fail to see deeply into the other. It is only as we listen to a person's story and share our story with him/her that we can presume to claim that we know the person. This is true of God. The psalmist proclaimed; 'the heavens declare the glory of God and the firmament proclaims his handiwork' (Psalm 19.1). The beauty and complexity of creation does give us some understanding of God. But it is only when God speaks to us that we can claim to have accurate knowledge of him.

Jesus is God coming into the world. He reveals who he is. In the Gospel according to John, Philip asks Jesus, 'Show us the Father and we shall be satisfied' (John 14.8). Jesus replies, 'He who has seen me has seen the Father' (v.9). And what do we see? We see a God of compassion, forgiveness and justice. A God who cares for the poor and outcast of the world, and a God who brings reconciliation and healing to his creation. John uses the image of 'Word', a term that implies revelation. The Gospel commences with the statement 'In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God and the Word was God' (John 1.1) and continues with the affirmation 'and the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, full of grace and truth' (v.14). And what do we see as we observe the Word? Not a God who is remote or detached, displaying the Greek character of 'apatheia' (a word meaning 'detachment'), but a God who 'gets his hands dirty'. God in Jesus came to restore creation, and the cry from the cross, 'Father forgive them for they do not know what they are doing' (Luke 23.34) is an affirmation that, in declaring forgiveness, we are reconciled to God and to one another.

We understand by listening to him, and we proclaim the good news of his love by our preparedness to work for compassion, forgiveness and justice. Rather than being 'a lot of words', the doctrine of the Holy Trinity is at the heart of our faith and works.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead. and the life of the world to come. Amen.
