A Reading from the First Letter of Paul to the Thessalonians

Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy, To the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace to you and peace.

We always give thanks to God for all of you and mention you in our prayers, constantly remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labour of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ.

For we know, brothers and sisters beloved by God, that he has chosen you, because our message of the gospel came to you not in word only, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with full conviction; just as you know what kind of persons we proved to be among you for your sake.

And you became imitators of us and of the Lord, for in spite of persecution you received the word with joy inspired by the Holy Spirit, so that you became an example to all the believers in Macedonia and in Achaia.

For the word of the Lord has sounded forth from you not only in Macedonia and Achaia, but in every place your faith in God has become known, so that we have no need to speak about it.

For the people of those regions report about us what kind of welcome we had among you, and how you turned to God from idols, to serve a living and true God, and to wait for his Son from heaven, whom he raised from the dead—Jesus, who rescues us from the wrath that is coming.

(1 Thessalonians 1.1-10)

A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

Then the Pharisees went and plotted to entrap him in what he said. So they sent their disciples to him, along with the Herodians, saying, "Teacher, we know that you are sincere, and teach the way of God in accordance with truth, and show deference to no one; for you do not regard people with partiality.

Tell us, then, what you think. Is it lawful to pay taxes to the emperor, or not?"

But Jesus, aware of their malice, said, "Why are you putting me to the test, you hypocrites?

Show me the coin used for the tax." And they brought him a denarius.

Then he said to them, "Whose head is this, and whose title?"

They answered, "The emperor's." Then he said to them, "Give therefore to the emperor the things that are the emperor's, and to God the things that are God's."

When they heard this, they were amazed; and they left him and went away.

In this encounter with Jesus they referred to an event in the mid second-century B.C. that is recorded in the Second Book of Maccabees, one of the books of the apocrypha. The seven brothers in his parable suggest the story of the seven sons of a Jewish woman, all of whom died under torture because of their refusal to deny the Law of Moses. They were being forced to make a choice; to eat swine's flesh or to be burnt to death. They chose the latter. Before the death of her youngest son, the woman encouraged him.

"I do not know how you came into being in my womb. It was not I who gave you life and breath, nor I who set in order the elements within each of you. Therefore the Creator of the world, who shaped the beginning of man and devised the origin of all things. will in his mercy give life and breath back to you again, since you now forget yourselves for the sake of his laws" (II Maccabees 7.22-23).

The story of the woman with the seven sons influenced the Pharisees. Unlike the Sadducees, they believed in the resurrection of the dead. Resurrection is an act of God's creation and, in Pharisaic thought, a vindication that God's purposes will be fulfilled. It seems that a clearer understanding of resurrection stemmed from the difficult experience of exile in Babylon during the sixth century B.C. Whereas their captors regarded creation as a divine act bringing order our of chaos, Jewish people came to recognise that creation is God's act of making something new out of nothing. He who fashioned the cosmos out of nothing makes humankind, and after death he wills the completion of every person in the resurrection life

At Bethany and following Lazarus's death, Jesus said to Lazarus's sister Martha; "I am the resurrection and the life; he who believes in me, even though he die, yet shall he live, and whoever lives and believes in me shall never die" (John 11.25-26). Jesus is the new Adam, and in his death and resurrection God's creation is made perfect with the gift of eternal life.

> Readings for **Twenty-First Sunday After Pentecost** 25th October, 2020 Deuteronomy 34.1-12 Psalm 90, 1-6, 13-17 1 Thessalonians 2.1-13 Matthew 22.34-46

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Dear People,

Today's Gospel reading contains two questions that were designed to embarrass Jesus. The first is asked by Pharisees, and Jesus's answer, "Render unto Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God that things that are God's" (Matthew 22.21), confounded his adversaries. The second is asked by Sadducees. The Sadducees were a small and elite group of religious teachers. It seems that they derived their name from Zadok, the high priest at the time of King David, and that they were very conservative. They adhered strictly to the Law of Moses, but they rejected the authority of other Hebrew scriptures. Unlike the Pharisees, they did not believe in the resurrection of the dead and the existence of angels and spirits. They were loyal to Roman officials and they regarded Jesus as a troublemaker. To them, Jesus was another Pharisee who ought to be sidelined.

The same day some Sadducees came to him, saying there is no resurrection; and they asked him a question, saving.

"Teacher, Moses said, 'If a man dies childless, his brother shall marry the widow, and raise up children for his brother.'

Now there were seven brothers among us; the first married, and died childless, leaving the widow to his brother.

The second did the same, so also the third, down to the seventh. Last of all, the woman herself died.

In the resurrection, then, whose wife of the seven will she be? For all of them had married her."

Jesus answered them, "You are wrong, because you know neither the scriptures nor the power of God.

For in the resurrection they neither marry nor are given in marriage, but are like angels in heaven.

And as for the resurrection of the dead, have you not read what was said to you by God.

'I am the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob'? He is God not of the dead, but of the living."

And when the crowd heard it, they were astounded at his teaching.

(Matthew 22.15-33)


The Nicene Creed
