





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Dear People,

Today is the Feast of Christ the King, the last Sunday in the liturgical year. Some Christians are critical of the observance, and images of kingship are judged as being incompatible with the intentions and actions of Jesus. But I think that it is important to keep in mind that Jesus invested traditional royal images with new meaning: the crown is made of thorns, the sceptre is a broken reed, the robe a torn rag and the throne a rough wooden cross. Jesus rejected the use of the power but he ministered with true authority. This authority was marked by humility, servanthood and suffering. In the latter years of his apostolic ministry, Paul wrote a letter to the Christians of Philippi. It includes the 'kenotic' hymn (the Greek word 'kenosis' means 'the act of emptying') and Paul 'summed-up' Jesus's ministry with a sublime statement.

Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death – even death on a cross. (Phil.2.5-8).

How can we be truly authoritative? I think that the answer is to be found in following Jesus's example. In the past, the Church was powerful, and secular images of kingship resonated strongly. But this has changed, and in the brave new world of modern Australia we cannot enforce control. We can live authoritatively, and the precedent is the life of Christ.

The old liturgical year has been difficult, and the Covid-19 lockdown has affected Church attendances and cash flow. Some have argued that Church decline has been 'fast-forwarded' and that we are now living in our future. How can we regain our position in society? In today's Gospel reading, the Parable of the Last Judgement (Matthew 25.31-46), Jesus asserted that the true test of religion is to be found in our response to the hungry, the thirsty, the stranger and the naked. He concluded: "Just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me". It is in caring for people and forgetting about power that we can be renewed.
