number of people who eat of it.

Your lamb shall be without blemish, a year-old male; you may take it from the sheep or from the goats.

You shall keep it until the fourteenth day of this month; then the whole assembled congregation of Israel shall slaughter it at twilight.

They shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and the lintel of the houses in which they eat it.

They shall eat the lamb that same night; they shall eat it roasted over the fire with unleavened bread and bitter herbs.

Do not eat any of it raw or boiled in water, but roasted over the fire, with its head, legs, and inner organs.

You shall let none of it remain until the morning; anything that remains until the morning you shall burn.

This is how you shall eat it: your loins girded, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand; and you shall eat it hurriedly.

It is the Passover of the LORD.

For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike down every firstborn in the land of Egypt, both human beings and animals; on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgments: I am the LORD.

The blood shall be a sign for you on the houses where you live: when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague shall destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt.

This day shall be a day of remembrance for you. You shall celebrate it as a festival to the LORD; throughout your generations you shall observe it as a perpetual ordinance.

A Reading from the Letter of Paul to the Romans

Let every person be subject to the governing authorities; for there is no authority except from God, and those authorities that exist have been instituted by God.

Therefore whoever resists authority resists what God has appointed, and those who resist will incur judgment.

For rulers are not a terror to good conduct, but to bad. Do you wish to have no fear of the authority? Then do what is good, and you will receive its approval;

for it is God's servant for your good. But if you do what is wrong, you should be afraid, for the authority does not bear the sword in vain! It is the servant of God to execute wrath on the wrongdoer.

Therefore one must be subject, not only because of wrath but also because of conscience.

For the same reason you also pay taxes, for the authorities are God's servants, busy with this very thing.

Pay to all what is due them—taxes to whom taxes are due, revenue to whom revenue is due, respect to whom respect is due, honour to whom honour is due.

Owe no one anything, except to love one another; for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law.

The commandments, "You shall not commit adultery; You shall not murder; You shall not steal; You shall not covet"; and any other commandment, are summed up in this word, "Love your neighbour as yourself."

Love does no wrong to a neighbour; therefore, love is the fulfilling of the law.

Dear People,

The corona virus pandemic has had a strong effect on the Church. From Sunday the 22nd March until Sunday the 26th July there were no public services in the Parish of Bundaberg. During the 'lockdown' the Reverend Danni Clark and I have maintained daily masses, and prayer has been offered on your behalf. The three churches were locked. But there has not been a day without a Church service in the Parish. The Anglican Dorcas Society 'Soup Kitchen' and 'Sausage Sizzle' have continued to operate, and emergency relief has been offered to the homeless and the unemployed. I have been grateful for the generosity of our people, and financial contributions have helped us to serve the people of Bundaberg, Bargara and Burnett Heads. In years to come we will look back with pride as we remember the goodness of so many Anglican Christians.

Although the corona virus pandemic continues to affect Queensland, the Church is beginning to operate normally. Many members of our congregations have returned to Sunday worship, and others are looking forward to being back soon. Social distancing, sanitising and other health precautions have continued to be used, and our churches are full of love, peace and joy.

What does it mean to be an Anglican in a world broken by illness, fear and financial stress? I think that there are five main issues.

First, we recognise that we are a people of worship. Worship is an expression of gratitude for all that God gives us, and it is an experience of peace and liberation. The heart of worship is the offering of the Eucharist, and as we receive the Holy Communion of the Body and Blood of Christ we are made sharers in his one perfect sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Sometimes we take things for granted, and in recent months we have come to recognise God's wonderful goodness and grace to us in the Blessed Sacrament.

Secondly, we are a people of scripture. The Bible is the word of God in that it bears faithful witness to him who is the word incarnate, our Lord Jesus Christ. We are invited to listen carefully to Jesus so that we can proclaim the good news of his love for all creation. We are not 'Bible bashers', but we are a people who are informed by God's will for us and all humanity. We listen to him, we pray to him and then, by his grace, we work in his name for the good of all.

Thirdly, we are a people of service. We are challenged to forget about ourselves and live with love for friends and neighbours. We live in a world that has become obsessed with 'self', and as a 'counter-cultural' community we are challenged to reveal a better and happier way of living. At Christ Church we encounter many people who do not attend Church services. Our first duty is to recognise the presence of Jesus and let go of judgements based on appearance, wealth, gender, race or sexual preference.

Fourthly, we are a people of justice. Compassion is not merely a feeling. The word is derived from two Latin words that mean 'to share in another's suffering'. This requires a preparedness to encounter rudeness, misunderstanding, cynicism and rejection. But this is the way that Jesus

"If another member of the church sins against you, go and point out the fault when the two of you are alone. If the member listens to you, you have regained that one.

But if you are not listened to, take one or two others along with you, so that every word may be confirmed by the evidence of two or three witnesses.

If the member refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and if the offender refuses to listen even to the church, let such a one be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector.
