Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia,

statement 'Catholics need not apply'. Sermons often included attacks on the theological and moral integrity of people who were different.

This sad history highlights an issue that is fundamental to Christianity; what do we mean by prayer?

First, prayer is not telling God things that he does not know. God knows all things. It is not trying to change his decisions. His will is perfect. Rather, prayer is both a careful listening to the prayer of the risen Lord Jesus Christ and a conscientious seeking to make his prayer our prayer. Writing to the Church of Rome, St Paul commented; "We do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with sighs too deep for words... because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God" (Romans 8.26, 27). We listen to Jesus, and he is telling us that we are to pray for the unity of his Church.

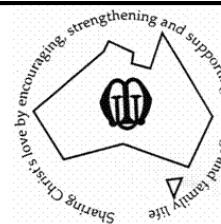
Secondly, prayer leads to action. The Latin word that is the root of the English word 'intercession' is 'intercedare'. It means 'being placed in the centre of a conflict'. If we pray for the unity of the Church we are required to do something about it, and the 'Church Crawl' this afternoon will present us with opportunity of expressing our love for our brothers and sisters in Christ.

Readings for Trinity Sunday—First Sunday After Pentecost

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Dear People,
Sectarian bitterness has been a feature of Australian culture, and until half a century ago Anglicans, Roman Catholics, Presbyterians and members of other churches did not always speak to one another. This did a great deal of damage to the proclamation of the Gospel, and it seems that Jesus's injunction, "By this will all people that you are my disciples, if you have love for another," (John 13.35) was not heeded. Jesus prayed that his followers would be one "so that the world may believe" (John 17.21), and it seems that many Australian Christians rejected his teaching. This bad behaviour was not unique to Australia. Dr Douglas Hyde was the first President of Ireland. His father was a Church of Ireland (i.e. Anglican) priest, and Dr Hyde remained a faithful member of his Church until his death in 1948. His Funeral Service was held in St Patrick's Cathedral, Dublin. All the members of the Government were Roman Catholic and, except for one person, they remained standing outside of the 'Protestant Cathedral' for the Service. Anglicans have been guilty of similar acts, and there have been incidences when secular employment advertisements in Church magazines included the

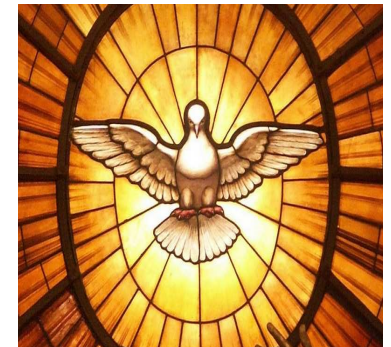
